Boston Fire Department	8 hour in-person training on emergency response, permitting, and inspections for the city's fire command level staff; and development of energy storage system project and safety protocol tracking system for the City of Boston.	\$314,697
Metropolitan Area Planning Council (MAPC)	Training for the 101 cities/towns in MAPC's region. Track 1 training is for fire professionals on fire code, permitting and peer review, and emergency response protocols. Track 2 training is for municipal officials on battery technology, applicable codes, risk mitigation best practices, impacts to public land use, health, and the environment. MAPC will also provide on-call technical assistance (TA) for permitting requests.	\$700,460
